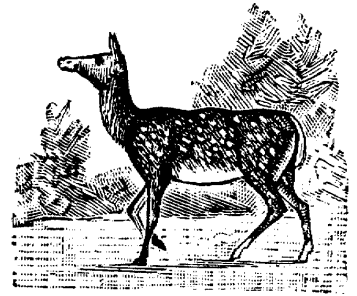

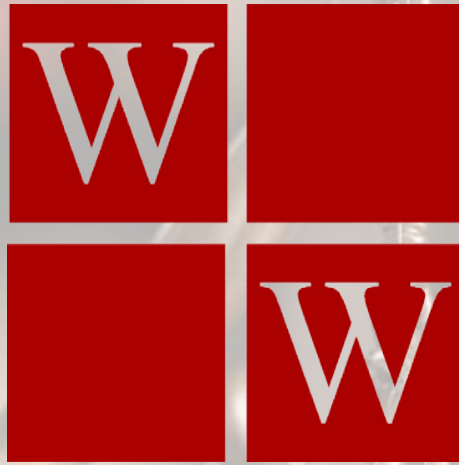

President's Corner

It's time to start thinking about our upcoming Community Association elections. This year, four directors are up for election: Mary Carroll Dickon, Sue Feiger, Joe Kindregan, and Donna Mora. All four will be running for reelection.

If you would like to add your name to the ballot, a nomination form can be found in this issue of the Press. Please complete the form and include a brief letter to the Board outlining your qualifications and reasons for running. You must be a resident in good standing to be eligible.

A reminder: you are running for a director position, not for a specific officer role. The president appoints board positions based on qualifications and the needs of the Board. If you are a tenant, you must include a letter from the homeowner granting permission for you to run.

Although the election will not be held until August 3rd, we want to give everyone plenty of time to consider participating.

You will also find the updated pool schedule in this issue. Thank you to everyone who has already volunteered. We still have openings, so please call me if you are interested in serving as a pool monitor or substitute. We ask for just one twohour shift per week. A meeting will be held the week before the pool opens to review duties and provide basic firstaid information.

A few reminders:

There will not be a Community Association meeting in May due to our Memorial Day Picnic and the clubhouse will be rented. On that day you will not be able to use the clubhouse so please use the bathrooms at the pool.

Please slow down. A resident recently reported that walking on our streets has become unsafe because of speeding. Someone was nearly hit. This is unacceptable. I have contacted the township to request additional signage, but in the meantime, please be considerate and drive safely.

Garbage cans - Please do not take the community garbage cans. They have UPI numbers and are assigned to us. If you need a larger can or a replacement, Stafford Township will provide one.

Missing items - We are still missing an Ellipse leg exerciser from the office, as well as a gallon of paint and paintbrushes. It is discouraging to see community property taken. Our volunteers already donate countless hours—and often their own money—for stamps, paper, decorations, supplies, food, tools, and more. Please be respectful of community property. If you need to borrow something, just ask. We will always do our best to help.

Spring is our time to clean up and get ready for the season. We could use help at the pool, the grove, and around the community with weeding, picking up branches and brush, cleaning sheds, and similar tasks. Signup sheets are posted on the bulletin board.

And don't forget to set aside a little something for the Plant Sale and to purchase tickets for the Women's Club Tea—both happening in May. Flyers with details are included in this issue.

Spring is a season of fresh starts, and it's a wonderful time to renew our commitment to each other and to our community. Whether you volunteer, run for the board, help a neighbor, or simply offer a smile on your morning walk, it all matters. Let's make this season one filled with kindness, cooperation, and friendship. Finally we can say **Welcome Spring!!!** Mother Nature has surely taken her time bringing us our daffodils, crocuses and tulips! Even though they are blooming a bit late we appreciate the vibrant colors that are sprinkled thru our neighborhoods.

With our first rate increase came into effect on April 1st and your Board of Trustees are happy to announce that we received a record number of on time payments at the new increased price. Thank you all for your cooperation and diligence in assisting with our increase in collections. Condo One dues are payable on **January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1**, with a grace period through the 15th. Payments received after that date will need to include a \$50 late fee. Rates are:

Quad 1 Bedroom \$ 517. Quad 2 Bedroom \$ 532.
Duplex 1 Bedroom \$ 550. Duplex 2 Bedroom \$ 577.
Single \$ 601.

If unforeseen situation arises that makes it difficult to meet these dates, please contact our Treasurer, Geri Hartnett. She will offer the resident an opportunity to make payment arrangements. Open communication helps us avoid the need for further action. However accounts that are two quarters past due will be referred to collections, as overdue balances impact the community as a whole.

Your Board of Trustees are reminding all homeowners and their relatives that they are not permitted to be working on the roofs or in the crawlspaces of the properties. **Only approved licensed and insured contractors that are hired by the Board are allowed to work on our roofs and crawlspaces.** We are asking for everyone's cooperation with this condition at all times. If you feel there is an issue call one of the Board members and relay the situation. This is a liability and insurance issue. Our insurance companies do not care if you are a tradesman or handyman. When it comes to insurance coverage if the Board did not hire you, you are not insured. Should there be any problems with the HOA property you were working on illegally you may be held liable. Kindly call a Trustee if you feel there is a problem.

Should you be doing work in your home we suggest you hire licensed and insured contractors. Please notify the Board of Trustees in writing when you are doing interior work. Again this is for insurance purposes that we be made aware of contractors doing interior work in Condo One. If you are in doubt call to verify with a Trustee.

All owners and or family must notify a member of the Board of Trustees before selling or vacating their units. Violating this notification can jeopardize the sale of

Each unit owner has the obligation to purchase public liability insurance to protect himself from claims due to accidents within his unit, and shall purchase casualty insurance on the contents within said unit...

4.) Fawn Lakes Condominium A, Section 2 Rules and Regulations (in part):

2. Alterations, replacements, additions, modification or changes to the common elements or to any outside or exterior of any unit are prohibited by the Master Deed of Condominium A, Section 2.

16. Vehicles, trailers, boats, etc. may not be parked or stored on the common elements.

FAWN LAKES CODE OF CONDUCT

We ask all residents of Fawn Lakes to make our community a welcoming and respectful place to live. As such, we expect our residents and their guests to treat others with respect and to abide by the rules in our Code of Conduct at all times.

If a resident experiences or witnesses unacceptable behavior, it should be brought to the attention of a Fawn Lake's officer or Director responsible for handling that issue. If any unacceptable behavior occurs in the pool area or at an event in the clubhouse, it should be reported to the person in charge. Residents are totally responsible for the behavior of their guests.

PROHIBITED ACTIONS:

1. Verbal abuse including insults, derogatory name calling and foul language
2. Aggressive or threatening behavior
3. Hostile touching or physical contact
4. Sexual harassment
5. Defacing, damaging or destroying any condo property or the property of other residents
6. Non-compliance with rules posted in the pool area, clubhouse and common grounds

If a resident is asked to stop displaying inappropriate behavior, immediate compliance will be expected.

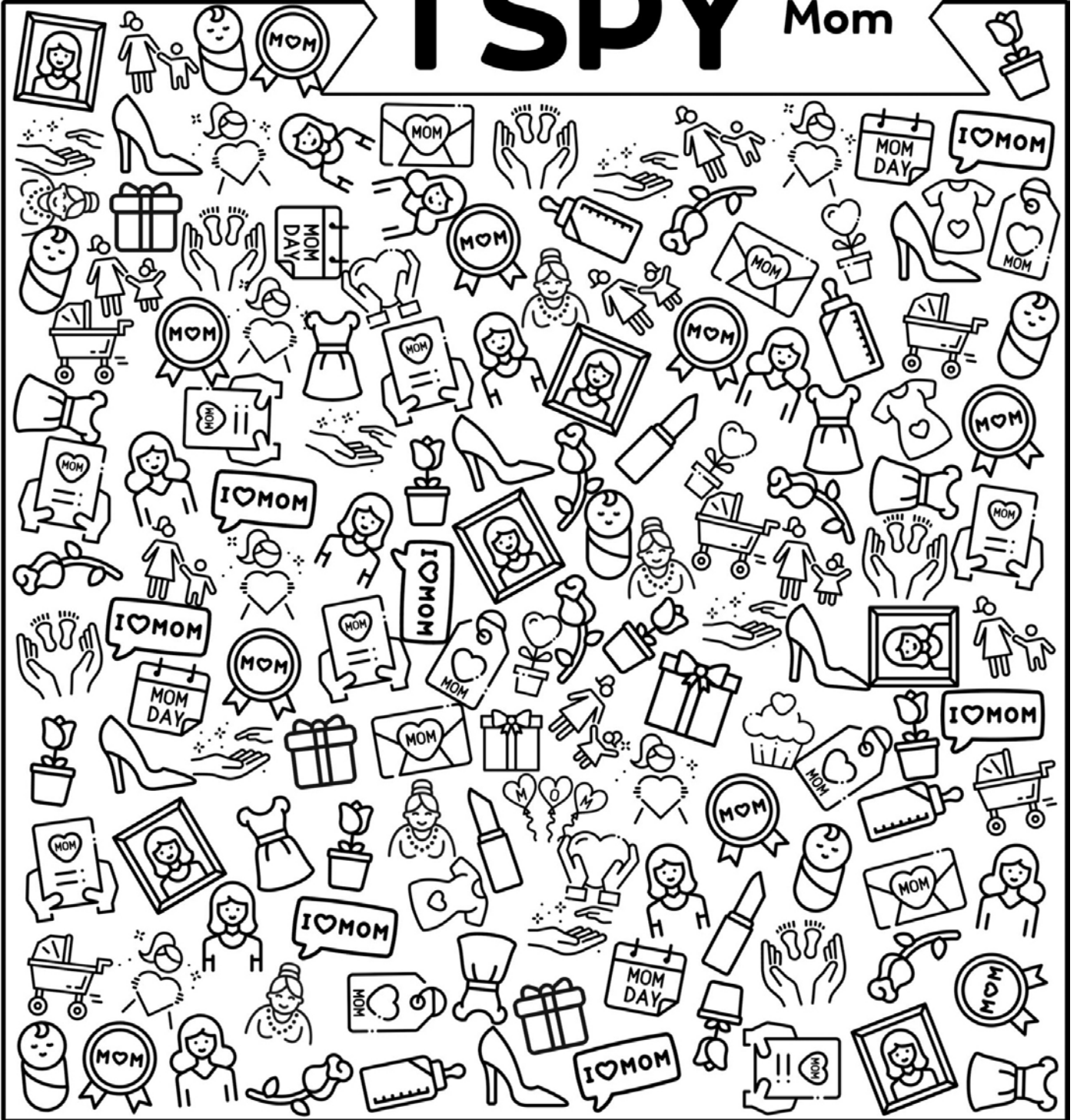
CONSEQUENCES:

1. 911 will be called if behavior is deemed to be dangerous to others or to the person exhibiting the dangerous behavior or refusal to leave the area at the time an event is finished.
2. Written warning will be given to the offender by the Board of Directors, for the **first** offense.
3. A **second** offense within a **six-month** period of time will result in a **three-month** loss of privileges to the clubhouse pool, or area where the offense has occurred. A meeting with the community board will be required before privileges are restored.
4. No refunds will be given if a resident or their guest is removed from an event due to non-compliance with Code of Conduct Rules.

Fawn Lakes is a volunteer community where residents give hours of time to maintain services, lower costs, and to provide a safe environment for fellow residents. Please help us continue this tradition.

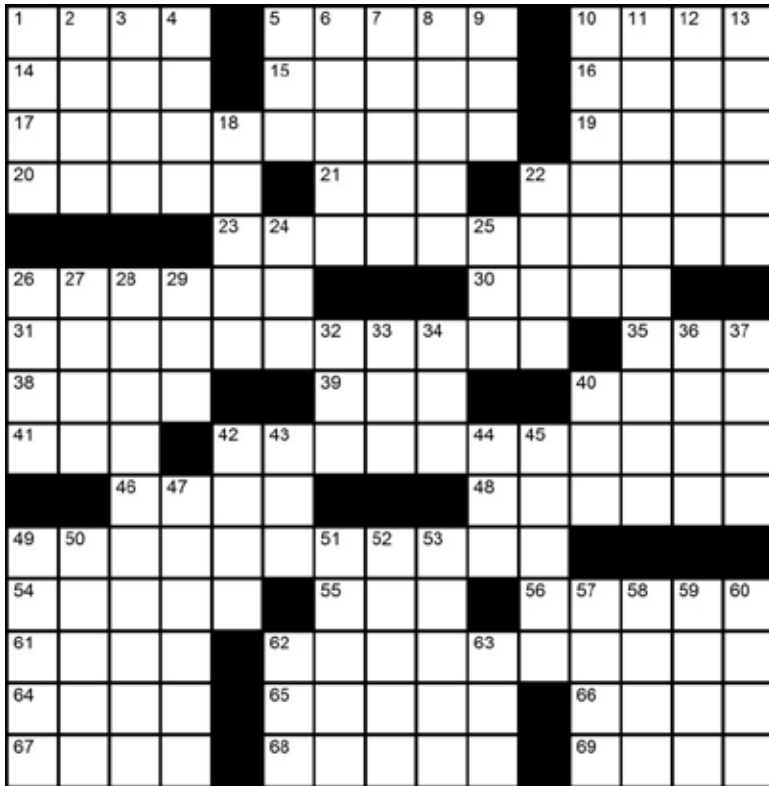
