President's Corner

June 2026

Today is Mother's Day—although by the time you read this, the holiday will have passed. Mother's Day has a long and meaningful history. It began in 1870 with Julia Ward Howe, the abolitionist and author of *The Battle Hymn of the Republic*, who called on women to unite in the name of peace. The idea was later championed by Anna Jarvis, who sought to honor her own mother's tireless dedication. Through her efforts, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Mother's Day a national holiday in 1914.

Today, Mother's Day is celebrated around the world. Its purpose is universal: to honor and appreciate mothers. It transcends cultures and differences, reminding us of the love, sacrifice, and hope that mothers bring into our lives. And isn't it true that we all wish for our children to have a better life than we had?

I miss my own mother deeply. I left teaching to care for her until Alzheimer's finally took her from me. I was never sure if she recognized me at the end, but I never forgot who she was. She was remarkable—raising four children, preparing delicious homemade meals we always ate together, and working as a registered nurse to provide the "extras," like her beloved oriental rugs and pretty clothes for me. She was a classic Italian mother who adored her sons and expected me to treat my three brothers like kings. I tried to break that habit when I married, but I followed in the footsteps of my mother and aunts. And I still say: if men had to give birth, the world would end! Not to put men down—I love and admire them—but facts are facts!

To all mothers, grandmothers, and women who nurture others in countless ways: Happy Mother's Day. Your work is often unseen, but it is never without value.

We have finally received our gaming permit, and you will notice that our 50/50 raffles are returning. A reminder: the portion of the proceeds belonging to the condo associations, community, Women's Club, and Men's Club must be turned in to a member of the Social Club for deposit into the checking account. These funds may be used **only** for charitable purposes. For example, in the past the community association used the balance of the 50/50 money for refreshments served at meetings but that is not a charitable expense. We award \$1,000 in scholarships each year, and raffle funds will help support that commitment.

I want to extend heartfelt thanks to all the women who contributed to the Women's Club Annual Tea. Because of your generosity, I was able to create 54 baskets, with additional items saved for next year. Special thanks to

Claire DeLuccia for organizing the event, to the women who decorated and cleaned up, and to those who prepared sandwiches and desserts—the desserts were some of the best I've ever tasted. Events like this require tremendous effort, and they succeed only because of your dedication. Volunteers truly keep Fawn Lakes running and make it a wonderful place to live.

Speaking of volunteers, the pool schedule is nearly complete. Please check the calendar as we still have a few openings. The weather has not cooperated and I am behind on power washing but the pool will open Memorial Day weekend whether I am finished or not. Poor Joe fell at the pool and broke a rib so he's behind schedule also. Things happen and we just have to deal with the hand we are dealt. I want to thank Jeff Paton and his crew, Chris Gural, and Tracy Smith and Michael Bahner for lifting and carrying the chaises and chairs out for us to clean.

A special thankyou to Barbara Gaspar for her generous donation toward bird seed. We were able to purchase two bags. We do not want to charge the community for bird seed, but it has become expensive. If you would like to join Barbara in supporting this effort, your help would be appreciated.

Earlier this year, the Invasive Species Management Act was signed into law. One of the plants identified as invasive is English ivy. Stafford Township has done an excellent job removing it, and I want to thank Don Hand for clearing it from Condo 3. Although ivy may look pretty on trees, it eventually strangles them and the tree will die. Please check your yard and remove any ivy growing on your trees. Our trees are part of what makes Fawn Lakes so special—peaceful, shaded, and inviting. People from other communities come here just to walk our treelined streets. Let's protect our trees so they remain long after we are gone.

As we step into another summer season, I hope you'll take a moment to enjoy the simple pleasures that make Fawn Lakes such a special place to live. Whether you choose to swim, read in the shade, or simply enjoy the company of neighbors, the pool and our community spaces offer a peaceful retreat. I look forward to seeing you throughout the season and sharing the warmth, friendship, and spirit that define our community.

Finally we can say **Welcome Spring!!!** Mother Nature has surely taken her time bringing us our daffodils, crocuses and tulips! Even though they are blooming a bit late we appreciate the vibrant colors that are sprinkled thru our neighborhoods.

With our first rate increase came into effect on April 1st and your Board of Trustees are happy to announce that we received a record number of on time payments at the new increased price. Thank you all for your cooperation and diligence in assisting with our increase in collections. Condo One dues are payable on **January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1**, with a grace period through the 15th. Payments received after that date will need to include a \$50 late fee. Rates are:

Quad 1 Bedroom \$ 517. Quad 2 Bedroom \$ 532.
Duplex 1 Bedroom \$ 550. Duplex 2 Bedroom \$ 577.
Single \$ 601.

If unforeseen situation arises that makes it difficult to meet these dates, please contact our Treasurer, Geri Hartnett. She will offer the resident an opportunity to make payment arrangements. Open communication helps us avoid the need for further action. However accounts that are two quarters past due will be referred to collections, as overdue balances impact the community as a whole.

Your Board of Trustees are reminding all homeowners and their relatives that they are not permitted to be working on the roofs or in the crawlspaces of the properties. **Only approved licensed and insured contractors that are hired by the Board are allowed to work on our roofs and crawlspaces.** We are asking for everyone's cooperation with this condition at all times. If you feel there is an issue call one of the Board members and relay the situation. This is a liability and insurance issue. Our insurance companies do not care if you are a tradesman or handyman. When it comes to insurance coverage if the Board did not hire you, you are not insured. Should there be any problems with the HOA property you were working on illegally you may be held liable. Kindly call a Trustee if you feel there is a problem.

Should you be doing work in your home we suggest you hire licensed and insured contractors. Please notify the Board of Trustees in writing when you are doing interior work. Again this is for insurance purposes that we be made aware of contractors doing interior work in Condo One. If you are in doubt call to verify with a Trustee.

All owners and or family must notify a member of the Board of Trustees before selling or vacating their units. Violating this notification can jeopardize the sale of your property. Be sure your Realtor is knowledgeable of

3.) Fawn Lakes Condominium A, Section 2, Bylaws, Book 4012, in part from Page 835: "(F) Unit owner's obligation. Each unit owner has the obligation to purchase public liability insurance to protect himself from claims due to accidents within his unit, and shall purchase casualty insurance on the contents within said unit..."

4.) Fawn Lakes Condominium A, Section 2 Rules and Regulations (in part):

"# 2. Alterations, replacements, additions, modification or changes to the common elements or to any outside or exterior of any unit are prohibited by the Master Deed of Condominium A, Section 2."

"# 16. Vehicles, trailers, boats, etc. may not be parked or stored on the common elements."

Bulk pickup occurs on the 4th week of the month. Only put items out the curb the weekend prior to the 4th week of the month. Disposed items on the lawn prior to the bulk pickup time may lead to a citation from the Township.

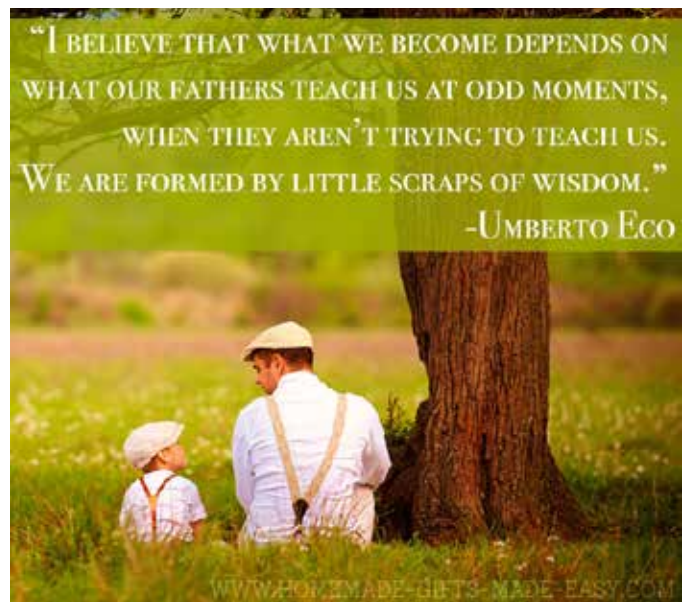

Pool Rules for 2026

1. There is no entrance to pool without a pool badge. Wristbands for additional guests may be purchased for \$2.00
2. Guests are not allowed without the resident. All members and guests must sign in at the pool monitor station.
3. The pool will be open Memorial Day weekend until the week after Labor Day at the discretion of the Pool Director.
4. Pool hours will be 10:00am- 6:00pm. Friday and Saturday the pool will be open 10:00am to 8:00pm. If no one is using the pool, or a monitor is not available, the pool will be closed at our discretion.
5. You must shower each time you enter the pool, especially after applying sun screen.
6. Bathing suits and swim trunks only. No street clothes allowed in the pool.
7. Children are permitted in the pool as long as they are accompanied by a resident.
8. If a child is not potty trained, a swim diaper is mandatory.
9. Children who cannot swim, must stay in the shallow end and not proceed past the rope. They must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for their supervision and safety.
10. Small pool toys are allowed as long as they do not interfere with others.
11. Diving, running and running jumps into water are prohibited.
12. No glass of any kind is allowed inside the pool area.
13. No smoking, vaping or chewing tobacco is allowed inside the gated area of the pool.
14. Pool safety equipment (painted red triangle on both sides of pool), must remain accessible at all times.
15. Long hair must be tied back.
16. Pool director, pool manager, and pool monitors are not lifeguards. You are responsible for you, your children, and your guest's safety.
17. No one is allowed in pump house except the pool director and pool manager.
18. Everyone who works at the pool are VOLUNTEERS. Rude behavior or arguments with staff will not be tolerated. Check your attitude at the door.

FAWN LAKES CODE OF CONDUCT

We ask all residents of Fawn Lakes to make our community a welcoming and respectful place to live. As such, we expect our residents and their guests to treat others with respect and to abide by the rules in our Code of Conduct at all times.

If a resident experiences or witnesses unacceptable behavior, it should be brought to the attention of a Fawn Lake's officer or Director responsible for handling that issue. If any unacceptable behavior occurs in the pool area or at an event in the clubhouse, it should be reported to the person in charge. Residents are totally responsible for the behavior of their guests.

PROHIBITED ACTIONS:

1. Verbal abuse including insults, derogatory name calling and foul language
2. Aggressive or threatening behavior
3. Hostile touching or physical contact
4. Sexual harassment
5. Defacing, damaging or destroying any condo property or the property of other residents
6. Non-compliance with rules posted in the pool area, clubhouse and common grounds

If a resident is asked to stop displaying inappropriate behavior, immediate compliance will be expected.

CONSEQUENCES:

1. 911 will be called if behavior is deemed to be dangerous to others or to the person exhibiting the dangerous behavior or refusal to leave the area at the time an event is finished.
2. Written warning will be given to the offender by the Board of Directors, for the **first** offense.
3. A **second** offense within a **six-month** period of time will result in a **three-month** loss of privileges to the clubhouse pool, or area where the offense has occurred. A meeting with the community board will be required before privileges are restored.
4. No refunds will be given if a resident or their guest is removed from an event due to non-compliance with Code of Conduct Rules.

Fawn Lakes is a volunteer community where residents give hours of time to maintain services, lower costs, and to provide a safe environment for fellow residents. Please help us continue this tradition.

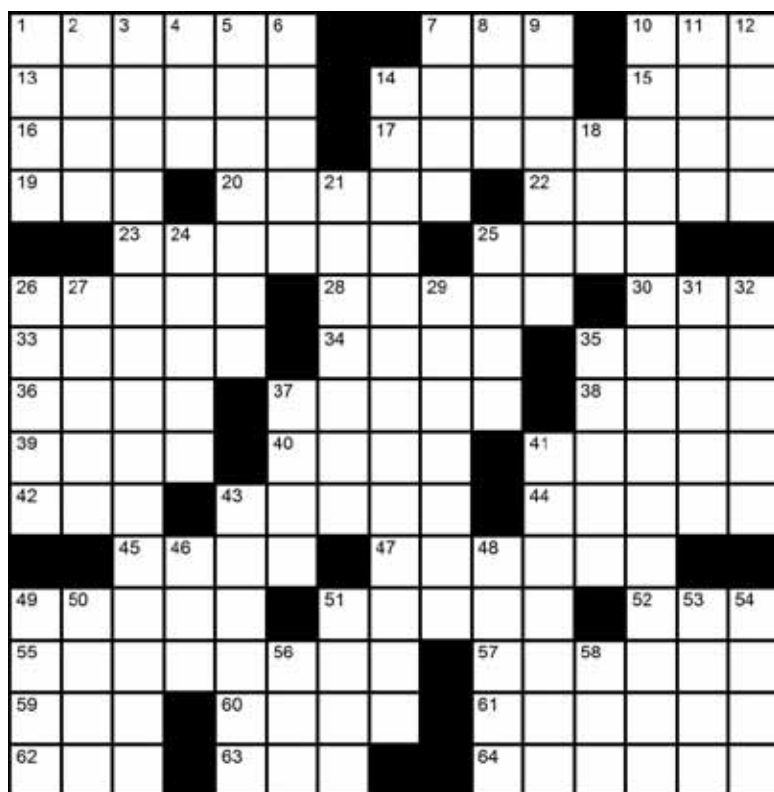

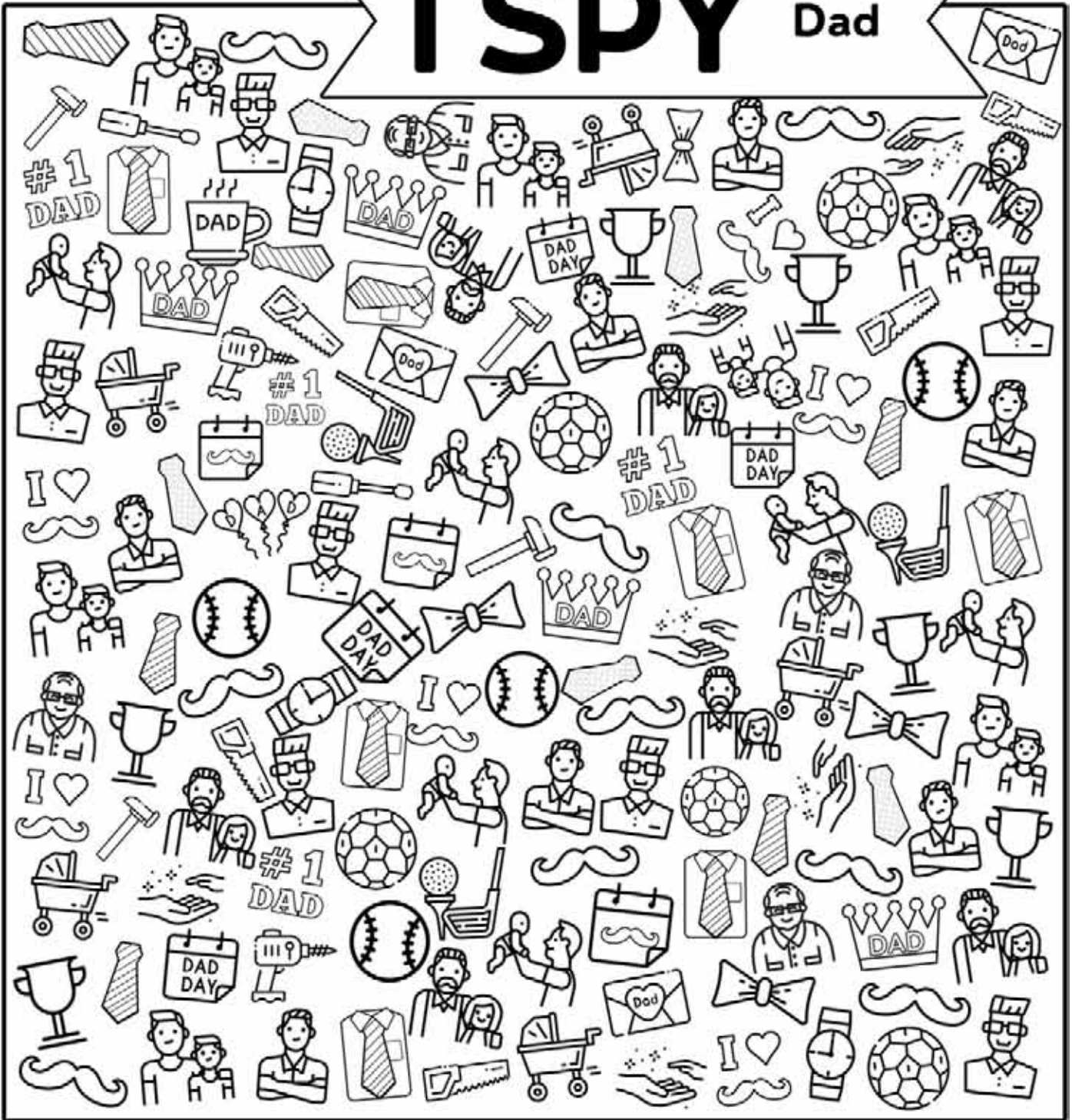

Photographing Baseball

It's baseball season and the Jersey Shore BlueClaws have started their season. If you enjoy shooting sports (one of my favorites) then take your camera to the stadium. They do not allow video and you cannot use a tripod. There are a few things you can do to increase your chances of a good shot.

A camera with a zoom lens will allow you to get closer to the play. Try to think ahead of the game to get prepared for the actions. For example, if there is a runner on first with less than two outs, there's a good chance there will be a play at second base, either a steal or double-play attempt. You can zoom in and focus on second base before the play starts so you're ready when the action happens. If you chase the ball around the field you probably won't get the best shots.

It can be fun to take images of the fans as well. There are always plenty of children enjoying a day at the stadium. Buster, the BlueClaws' mascot, and the stadium crew are always entertaining as well.
